Prior to commencing BVSc studies, Brett completed a Bachelor of Biomedical Sciences with Class 1 Honours at James Cook University. His honours research was in the field of Microbiology and Immunology and focused on Helicobacter pylori infection in cats. Brett graduated as a veterinarian from the University of QLD with Class I Honours in 2001 and worked in mixed animal practice on the outskirts of Brisbane. In 2004 he returned to the University of QLD to undertake a pathology internship/residency funded by QML Vetnostics, and a concurrent Masters research project investigating E.coli serotype 0157 infection in cattle.
